Introduction

From time to time circumstances arise when, ICC Austin and a member may benefit from a mutual contract cancellation. Contract cancellations are expected to be rare events primarily for humanitarian reasons. The vast majority of members wishing to end a contract early are expected to follow the Early Termination Policy.

The purpose of this policy is to expedite the contract cancellation process in cases when it would be unkind, unfair, or unwise to follow the Early Termination Policy.

Definitions

- "Contract Cancellation" is the mutual termination of a member resident agreement.
- "Member Resident Agreement" is the contract that grants the right of occupancy in an ICC Austin house to a member.
- "Release" is a written agreement between ICC Austin and a member specifying the terms of the contract cancellation.

Policy

- 1. The Executive Director or Membership Director, may elect to cancel a member resident agreement only if one or more of the following apply:
 - ICC Austin's inability, after a reasonable time to attain compliance or offer reasonable accommodation, to fulfill the member resident agreement obligations
 - the member's death
 - the death of an immediate family member
 - serious medical problems
 - serious and credible threat to ICC Austin interests

Procedure

2. When possible, a member whose contract is being cancelled must sign a release and provide reasonable evidence of the circumstances.
